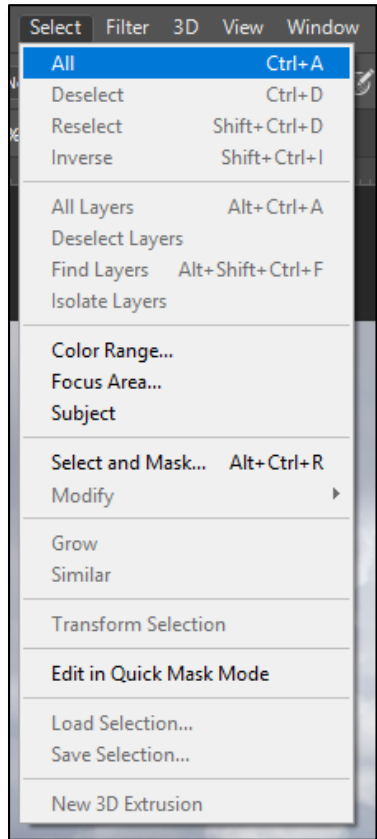


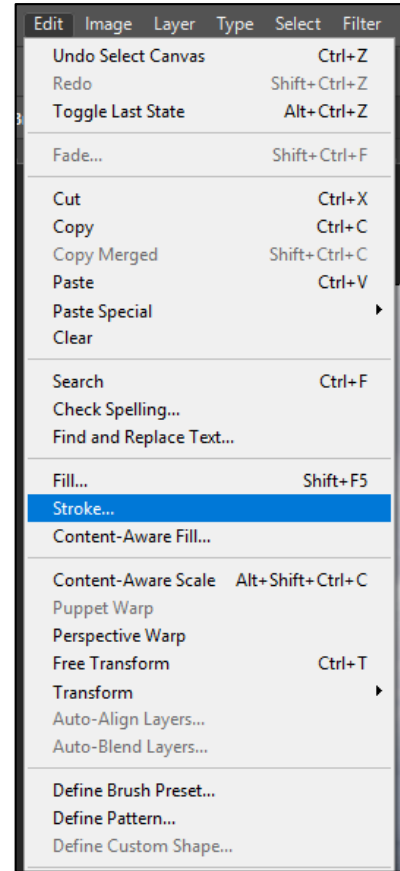
Placing a Line (Stroke) Around an Image

The *Colour Space* affects how your image will look on various outlets including the internet. *sRGB* is the Space that is most widely supported and is fairly standard nowadays. This quick tutorial shows how to change to this Colour Space.

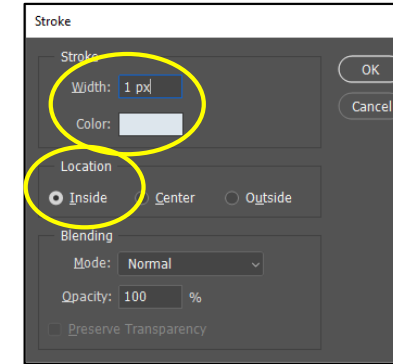
- 1 Once you have sized the image to your desired dimensions, Click on *Select >> All* (Ctrl A) to select the whole image.



- 2 Now click on *Edit >> Stroke*.



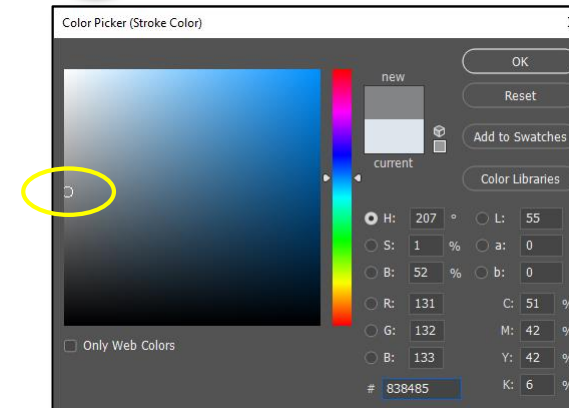
- 3 The settings below will generally give a good result.



Set the *Width* to 1 pixel.
Set the *Location* to *Inside*.
Click on the *Colour* box.

Using White and or a large border often distracts from the image that it surrounds so keep the Stroke low-key.

- 4 Select a colour for your border.



Typically a mid-grey colour works well on mono and most colour images. Selecting a colour from within the image can work well too. Click OK to apply the border.
