Graphics in Text

This worksheet shows you how to fill text with a picture or graphic, using a simple clipping procedure in three layers. You can create this effect with any text and any graphic combination. This is effect is called 'Clipping'.

Create a new blank layer to your desired size; in this instance I have used a standard 1920 x 1080 pixels with a white background. [Ctrl-Shft-N].


Using the *Text* [*T*] tool, type your chosen text using a chunky font and size it accordingly. Here I have used the 'Ash' font and centred it on the page.



Next, identify the image that you want to use to fill the text. On the Menu bar select *File > Place Embedded* and go to the folder where your image is saved. Select the image and click the 'Tick' symbol on the Menu bar.

The image will now cover the text and will show as the topmost layer in the *Layers* panel.

Click on the lines symbol in the top right of the *Layers* panel.



Ensure that the Layers Palette is showing, press F7 if it is not visible.

From the drop down list select Create Clipping Mask [Ctrl-Alt-G].


Note: This effect is also possible with shapes as well as text. So, if you want to create a rectangle, circle or custom shape just treat it as you would the text layer.

The image will now be constrained to the shape of the text, as shown below.



To finish off the effect we will place a Stroke around the text and place a shadow behind it.

Right click the Text layer and choose *Blending Options*...



Select *Stroke* and set the size to 1 pixel in black.

Select *Drop Shadow* and set the values as below.



Click *OK* to apply
